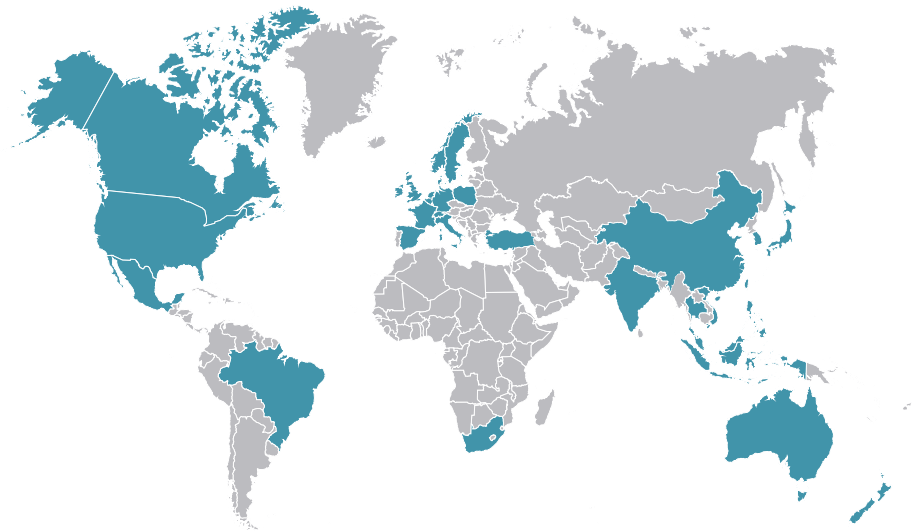




Apple Distinguished Schools Around the World

Requirements

Established one-to-one programme

A one-to-one Mac or iPad programme for students and faculty has been in place for more than two academic years. All students in a school use Apple devices as their primary learning device, and all teachers use Apple devices as their primary teaching device.

Innovative use of the Apple platform

Faculty deeply integrates Apple apps (Photos, iMovie, GarageBand, Pages, Keynote, Numbers, iBooks Author, and Clips), educational apps from the App Store, books from Apple Books, and other digital resources into the curriculum.

Faculty proficiency with iPad or Mac

Teachers are highly proficient in the use of Apple products. For K–12 schools in countries where Apple Teacher is available, 75 percent of teachers in a school must be recognised as Apple Teachers before the Apple Distinguished School application deadline. Apple reviews all requests to ensure that schools meet the current programme qualifications. Qualified schools then receive an invitation to complete the application process.
